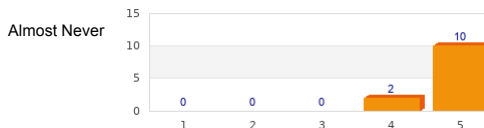

1. Evaluation of Instructor

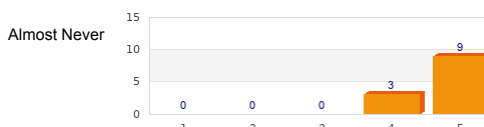
1.1) The instructor presented the course material clearly. Almost Always **n=12**

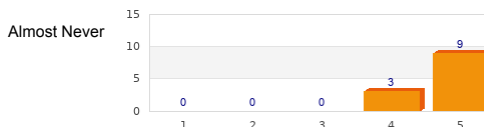
1.4) Tests and assignments were related to material covered in class. Almost Always **n=12**

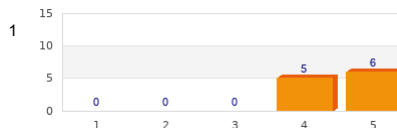

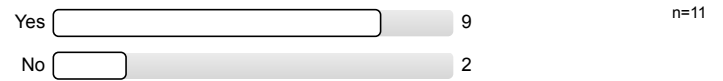


2.3) Please provide an overall rating of this course.

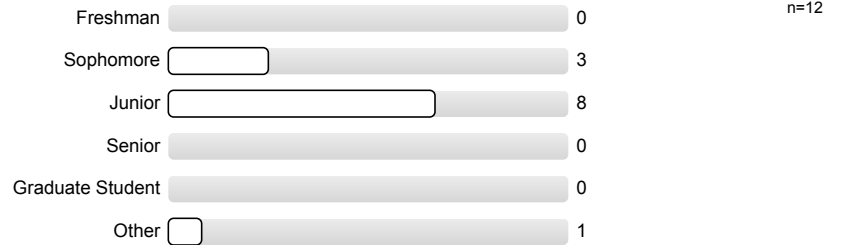

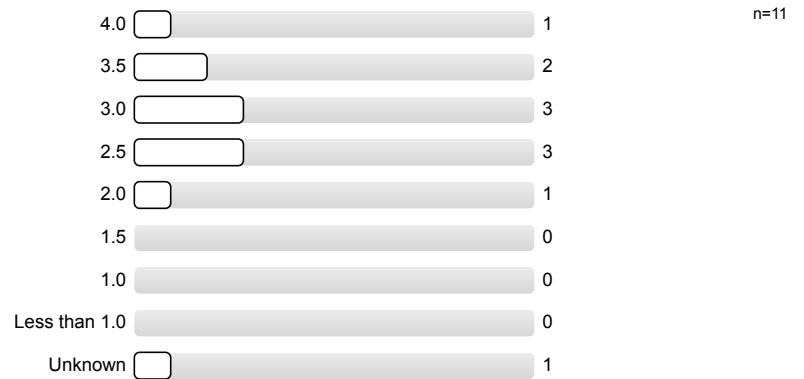

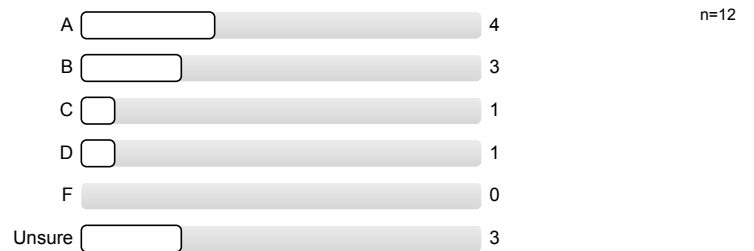
